STATEMENT: MN Police Association on charges dropped against State Patrol Trooper Ryan Londregan

(St. Paul, Minn.) -- This evening Hennepin County Mary Moriarty announced she was dropping all charges against State Patrol Trooper Ryan Londregan.

Minnesota Police and Peace Officers Association Executive Director Brian Peters said, **“Open season on law enforcement needs to end – on the streets and in the courtroom. Trooper Londregan should have never been charged, and we are glad this political case is over. Enough is enough.”**

Minnesota Police and Peace Officers Association General Counsel and former Washington County Prosecutor Imran Ali said, **"The justice system is not a science experiment. Prosecutor are ministers of justice. This case was example of an injustice that has been corrected, but the damage remains. This prosecutor divided our communities all in the name of politics.
